Current Steps

- ▶ Following CDC & KDHE Guidelines and Recommendations
- ▶ Governor Kelly Executive Orders #'s 200-04 & 20-05
 - ▶ No gathering's over 50 people for next 8 weeks.
 - ▶ Suspend Utility Disconnects until April 15, 2020.
- ▶ Common Sense:
 - ▶ Social Distancing
 - ▶ Hand Washing
 - ▶ Covering Coughs
 - ▶ Staying home when sick
- ▶ Enhanced Cleaning & Sanitizing
 - ▶ Building Foggers
- ▶ Prohibited staff travel
- ▶ Dept. Heads & Essential Staff - Remote Capabilities

Recommended Future Steps:

- ▶ Triggering Event - Upon having a confirmed case within 60 miles of Great Bend. Then the following actions would occur.
- ▶ City Hall would close to the public until further notice.
 - ▶ Building Permits would be handled electronically
 - ▶ Council meetings would not be affected
- ▶ Front Door would be closed to walk-in traffic until further notice.
 - ▶ Utility Payments:
 - ▶ Drive-up window, Drop Boxes, Auto Bank Draft or On-line
 - ▶ All meeting room events scheduled within the next 60 days would be canceled. No new bookings before 60 days. Bookings that are cancelled as a result of this will have first opportunity to re-book for a future date.
- ▶ Events Center will be closed to the public until further notice.
 - ▶ All events scheduled within the next 60 days would be canceled. No new bookings before 60 days. Bookings that are cancelled as a result of this will have first opportunity to re-book for a future date.
- ▶ Brit Spaugh Zoo would close to the public until further notice.
- ▶ Wetlands Aquatic Center would be closed until further notice.
